CITY COUNCIL MEETING  
January 21 2008

Council for the City of Dry Ridge met in regular session on January 21, 2008, at 5:30 p.m. at the Dry Ridge City Building, 31 Broadway, Dry Ridge, Kentucky, 41035, with the following present:

Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

Mayor Crupper presented the agenda for Council approval and requested General Discussion be added as Item B. under New Business. Council member Mathew Hicks requested Item C. First Reading Ordinance Amending Personnel Policy be added under New Business.

Council member Kenny Edmondson moved, Council member Jamie Webster seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of Item B. General Discussion and Item C. First Reading Ordinance Amending Personnel Policy under New Business. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Norman Ferguson-yes, Mathew Hicks-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O’Nan-yes, Jamey Webster-yes.

#### REPORTS

#### MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Supervisor Bobby Robbins reported more salt was just ordered and Maintenance personnel would be pre-treating streets tonight.

#### POLICE

Mayor Crupper presented the Police report. Mayor Crupper stated Chief Webb had a prior commitment and could not be present tonight.

#### FIRE

Chief Robert Bruin stated he would have November, December, January and Year 2007 reports by the next Council meeting.

Mayor Crupper stated Chief Bruin and the Fire Department did an excellent job hosting the Fire Symposium on January 19 and 20, 2008.

#### OLD BUSINESS

A. SECOND READING ORDINANCE 722-2008 KLC LEASE FINANCING  
AMBULANCE

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the second reading of Ordinance 722-2008 for the KLC lease financing for the purchase of an ambulance.

City Council member Norman Ferguson moved, Council member Jason O'Nan seconded to adopt Ordinance 722-2008. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Norman Ferguson-yes, Mathew Hicks-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

B. APPOINTMENT/APPROVAL PLANNING AND ZONING COMMISSION

Mayor Crupper stated some Planning and Zoning Commission members need to be reappointed.

Council member Jamie Webster stated he believed Vernon Webster had already been reappointed.

City Clerk Cindy Harris stated that she could not find in the minutes where the last appointments of Vernon Webster, Brooke Rider, or Tony Brewer occurred. Becky Ruhoff, Grant County Planning and Zoning also did not have any documents from the City reflecting the reappointments.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated there is a provision that if a board member failed to get reappointed they would continue on; however, if for whatever reason the City discovered someone was not reappointed timely then a reappointment and oath needed to take place immediately.

City Clerk Cindy Harris will check the minutes.

This will be placed on the agenda February 4, 2008.

NEW BUSINESS

A. ZONING

Mayor Crupper stated that Mr. Lunsford had inquired about purchasing the Lawrence property on Warsaw Avenue to construct apartments; however, four parking spaces are required for apartments and there is not enough room to construct the apartments with the required parking spaces.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated there is no relief provision for parking by the Board of Adjustments within the Zoning Ordinance. The Zoning Ordinance recently adopted requires four parking spaces for each apartment.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated that in order to change the parking provision, a public hearing under the Grant County Planning and Zoning Commission would be held, two separate readings of an Ordinance, vote, and publication of the ordinance by the City of Dry Ridge.

Mayor Crupper and Council decided to discuss this further onl February 4, 2008, Council meeting.

#### B. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Mayor Crupper noted that Council had received a copy of correspondence requesting relief from the high insurance premium as a result of the depth of the bowl at the skate park. Originally Council was told the insurance premium would not increase with the skate park provided certain requirements were met; however, the design of the skate park was different than originally planned.

Mayor Crupper had a contractor look at the bowl. Mayor Crupper requested authority to request proposals to reduce the depth of the bowl at the skate park from 6 to 3 feet to eliminate the extra insurance premium.

Council member Norman Ferguson moved, Council member Fred Money seconded to give Mayor Crupper authority to research and bring back a recommendation to Council on reducing the depth of the bowl from 6 to 3 feet. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Norman Ferguson-yes, Mathew Hicks-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.


#### C. FIRST READING ORDINANCE 723-2008 AMENDING PERSONNEL POLICY

Council member Mathew Hicks moved, Council member Jamie Webster seconded to change the Personnel Policy to include anytime a reportable accident for injury or property damage occurred, an alcohol/drug test would be required by the driver, operator, or person injured. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Norman Ferguson-yes, Mathew Hicks-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the first reading of Ordinance 723-2008 with the two changes in the Personnel Policy for mandatory alcohol/drug testing when a reportable accident occurred with an injury or property damage and the change to the benefit section for health insurance or other benefits as provided.
