Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

Mayor Crupper presented the agenda for approval.

REPORTS

FIRE

Mayor Crupper asked Council if they had questions concerning the Fire Report sent previously in Council packets.

Fire Chief Robert Bruin asked Council for permission to review the Fire Service Charges Ordinance with City Attorney Michael Mulvey, make the necessary changes, and bring to Council next month for a first reading.

Council agreed for City Attorney Michael Mulvey and Fire Chief Robert Bruin to make the necessary changes to the ordinance and bring to the next meeting for a first reading of the ordinance.

POLICE

Mayor Crupper stated that a police report was also sent in Council packets.

MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins presented Council with a written report, discussed start up cost of approximately \$9000 to use brine which would save back in the amount of salt purchased in approximately two years.

Council discussed the costs of shipping the equipment, the cost savings in the future, and the effectiveness of the brine.

Council asked Bobby Robbins to bring exact costs, locations of equipment, and more information to the next Council meeting.

Mayor Crupper stated that he wanted to leave the lights for the skate park on until later in the year even though the restrooms would have to be winterized within the next few weeks.

OLD BUSINESS

A. SECOND READING ORDINANCE 735-2008 SEWER SMOKE TESTING

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the second reading of Ordinance 735-2008 requiring smoke testing.

Council member Jamie Webster moved, Council member Kenny Edmondson seconded to adopt Ordinance 735-2008, an ordinance requiring sewer system smoke testing. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-absent, Jamie Webster-yes.

B. FIRST READING BLIGHTED PROPERTY ORDINANCE

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated he wanted to review the lengthy ordinance with Council member Encil Webster before presenting to the Council.

C. SECOND READING ORDINANCE 736-2008 TEXT AMENDMENT DAYCARE PERMITTED USE IN CENTRAL BUSINESS DISTRICT ZONE

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the second reading of Ordinance 736-2008 text amendment of CBD zone to permit daycares.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Karen Glore seconded to adopt ordinance 736-2008, an ordinance permitting adult/child day care centers in Central Business Zones. Motion carried. Mayor Crupper stated he attended two days at the KLC convention held in Louisville last week. Mayor Crupper stated it was very informative with discussions on costs of workers compensation and insurance and budgets.

Mayor Crupper recognized John Renaker, a member of the Cruise In Club.


John Renaker thanked Council for their support and stated the cruise in would be held next year starting in the Spring.
