

ORDINANCE NO. 303-1977

AN ORDINANCE REPEALING ORDINANCE 280-1975,  
AND RAISING THE WATER RATES TO ALL CUSTOMERS  
IN DRY RIDGE

WHEREAS the City of Dry Ridge purchases water from two suppliers; the Bullock Pen Water District and the City of Williamstown, and

WHEREAS both the City of Williamstown and the Bullock Pen Water District have increased the prices which the City must pay for water, and

WHEREAS the water rates to the customers of Dry Ridge must yield sufficient revenue to pay for the water consumed, and maintenance and operation costs of the system, and a reserve for emergencies,

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:


SECTION ONE

Ordinance Number 280-1975 is hereby repealed.


SECTION TWO

The minimum water bill shall be Five Dollars (\$5.00) for the first two thousand (2,000) gallons or fraction thereof used each month. The rate of one dollar and forty cents (\$1.40) per thousand gallons shall apply to the next eight thousand (8,000) gallons consumed over the minimum each month, and the rate of one dollar and twenty cents (\$1.20) per thousand gallons shall apply to all water consumed in excess of ten thousand (10,000) gallons each month.
