

ORDINANCE NO. 421-1987 -

AN ORDINANCE PROVIDING PENALTIES FOR  
VIOLATIONS OF ORDINANCE NO. 420-1987

NOW THEREFORE BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE  
AS FOLLOWS:

Any person who shall violate any provision of Ordinance No. 420-1987 which the City feels necessitates a cleanup, the owner of said property, or user of said article, shall be responsible for cleanup. In the event the owner of said property or article does not effect the cleanup the City may have the item cleaned and have a lien against the property or article for the value of services used in effecting the cleanup. The City shall bill the owner of the property or user of said article for the amount paid to have the premises cleaned and in the event the owner or user fails to pay the city said amount, a lien shall be placed against the property of the owner or user for said amount and said amount shall be added to the tax bill for the following year.

In the event a violation of Ordinance No. 420-1987 occurs which results in a motor vehicle being hauled away by the City, the owner of said motor vehicle is responsible to the City for the value of services in towing away said motor vehicle. No vehicle shall be released to owner without payment being made prior to said release.

Any person, firm, partnership or corporation violating any provisions of Ordinance No. 420-1987 shall be fined not less than \$25 nor more than \$500 for each offense, and each day they

fail or refuse to comply with the provisions of said Ordinance shall constitute a separate offense.
