

ORDINANCE NO. 486-1992

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE RELATING TO ESTABLISHMENT OF 911 SERVICE

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge is of the opinion that it would be in the best interest of the citizens of the City of Dry Ridge to provide a more efficient means to dispatch emergency services;

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge believes the establishment of a 911 service would enhance the general health and welfare of all citizens and residents of the City of Dry Ridge; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge is empowered by KRS 65.760 to establish 911 emergency service within the incorporated limits of the city and join with other governmental units and legislative bodies to provide such service.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS SO FOLLOWS, TO-WIT:

1. There shall be established within the incorporated limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Grant County, Kentucky, a 911 emergency telephone service.
2. Funds necessary for the establishment and continuing operation of said service shall be derived from charges to be collected from local exchange telephone subscribers in the area to be served by the 911 emergency telephone service on an individual exchange line basis limited to a maximum of twenty-five (25) lines per account.
3. All revenues from a tax or fee expressly levied to fund 911 emergency telephone services shall be expended solely for the funding and operating the 911 emergency telephone service and for no other purpose.
4. Any participating governmental unit or legislative body may apply for and so accept federal monies and any contributions or donations made from any source legal for the purpose of funding and operating the 911 emergency telephone service.
5. The actual day to day operations of 911 services shall be governed by any and all controlling laws and regulations of the Commonwealth of Kentucky and the United States together with the provisions of any interlocal agreement forthcoming and entered into by the City of Dry Ridge and any other governmental unit or legislative body concern-

ing the herein 911 emergency telephone service.

6. Any forthcoming interlocal agreement necessary and referred to herein must be approved by the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky.

7. This Ordinance shall supersede any previous ordinance or ordinances of the City of Dry Ridge heretofore enacted and ordained concerning 911 emergency telephone services.

8. This Ordinance shall become operative, effective and be in full force and effect when duly passed, ordained and ordered published according to law.
