

ORDINANCE NO. 530-1995

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, JOINT WITH THE COUNTY OF GRANT AND THE CITIES OF CORINTH, CRITTENDEN AND WILLIAMSTOWN PROVIDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A GRANT COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION CENTER, THE LEVYING OF TAXES PURSUANT TO THE KENTUCKY REVISED STATUTES, THE PURCHASE OF NECESSARY EQUIPMENT, AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE FUNDING OF A GRANT COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION CENTER.

BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY:

Section I

Grant County, Kentucky shall levy a tax on each telephone line terminating within Grant County whether within or without any of the above-named cities and each city waives the right to levy such tax and to collect the proceeds therefrom.

Section II

Grant County, Kentucky will levy a tax of ninety-nine cents (\$0.99) on each telephone line terminating in Grant County, of which three percent (3%) thereof shall be paid to Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company for its charges in collecting and remitting such tax; plus any and all infrastructure costs to the Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company.

Section III

Other charges, if any, authorized to be made by Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company shall be considered non-regulated fees and shall be so entered on individual bills and will not be charged against the tax levied.

Section IV.... Provides for the purchase and installation of equipment at the E911 dispatching center; use of tax proceeds for such costs and installation of equipment; and use of funds to operate the Grant County P.S.C.C..

Section V..... Provides for the use of tax proceeds and revenues for needed dispatching services.

Section VI.... Provides for the City of Williamstown's continuation of emergency dispatching and other dispatching services; the consideration for same to and by the City of Williamstown; and reference and incorporation of the Interlocal Agreement of the parties hereto and the future obligations of the Grant County P.S.C.C..

Section VII... Provides that the City of Williamstown shall continue the operation of the present operation of the dispatching center until such time as the operation is transferred to the Board of Directors of the Grant County P.S.C.C.

Section VII... Provides the covenants and conditions applicable to the above transfer of the dispatching center by the City of Williamstow to the Board of Directors of the Grant County P.S.C.C..

Section IX.... Provides for the severability, invalidity, validity and the due enforceability of the several provisions and parts of this ordinance.

Section X..... Provides that all ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

Section XI.... Provides when this ordinance shall become effective.



ORDINANCE NO. 1995 - 530

JOINT ORDINANCE OF THE COUNTY OF GRANT AND OF THE CITIES OF CRITTENDEN, CORINTH DRY RIDGE AND WILLIAMSTOWN, KENTUCKY

AN ORDINANCE OF GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY AND THE CITY OF CRITTENDEN AND THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE AND THE CITY OF WILLIAMSTOWN AND THE CITY OF CORINTH PROVIDING FOR THE IMPLEMENTATION OF A GRANT COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATION CENTER, THE LEVYING OF TAXES PURSUANT TO THE KENTUCKY REVISED STATUTES AND THE PURCHASE OF NECESSARY EQUIPMENT AND TO PROVIDE FOR THE FUNDING OF A GRANT COUNTY PUBLIC SAFETY COMMUNICATIONS CENTER.

BE IT ORDAINED by Grant County, Kentucky, and

BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Crittenden, and

BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Corinth, and

~~BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Dry Ridge, and~~

BE IT ORDAINED by the City of Williamstown

WHEREAS, the Cities and the County desire to establish a single Grant County Public Safety Communication Center/Emergency Service Record Center to be located in the Williamstown City Building and to jointly fund and control such Grant County Public Safety Communication Center, each of the governmental agencies named above, by the adoption of this ordinance, agree:

SECTION I

Grant County, Kentucky shall levy a tax on each telephone line terminating within Grant County whether within or without any of the above-named cities and each city waives the right to levy such tax and to collect the proceeds therefrom.

SECTION II

Grant County, Kentucky will levy a tax of ninety-nine cents (\$0.99) on each telephone line terminating in Grant County, of which three percent (3%) thereof shall be paid to

Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company for its charges in collecting and remitting such tax; plus any and all infrastructure costs to the Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company.

SECTION III

Other charges, if any, authorized to be made by Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company shall be considered non-regulated fees and shall be so entered on individual bills and will not be charged against the tax levied.

SECTION IV

Grant County, Kentucky shall purchase all necessary equipment and pay for its installation at the present Grant County Dispatching Center, Williamstown City Building, 400 North Main Street, Williamstown, Kentucky and shall use an appropriate portion of the proceeds of such tax to defray the cost of such equipment and its installation and financing charges in connection therewith. The balance of such fund shall be utilized for the purposes of operating the Grant County Public Safety Communications Center.

SECTION V

The parties recognize that the funds derived from the above-mentioned tax can be used only for the receipt of emergency calls and for the dispatching of emergency equipment. The City of Williamstown has for many years furnished, with payments from Grant County, Dry Ridge and Crittenden, an emergency dispatching center which also was utilized for the dispatching of the personnel and equipment of the City of Williamstown and its electrical, water, sewer, and cable TV enterprise. The parties agree that the Grant County Public Safety Communication Center will continue to dispatch the City of Williamstown personnel, water department equipment and personnel, sewer department equipment and personnel, electric department equipment and personnel, cable TV department equipment and personnel on a non-priority basis.

SECTION VI

In consideration of such service the City of Williamstown will continue to furnish to the Grant County Public Safety Communication Center the facilities now occupied by the Grant County Dispatching Center, all of the equipment now utilized by the Grant County Dispatching Center and heat, water, electricity and other utilities as now furnished in consideration for a payment monthly of a sum equal to the average monthly cost of one dispatcher including wages and all benefits and consistent with the Inter-Governmental Agreement attached hereto for a minimum period of one (1) year and a period of time not to exceed three (3) years. Thereafter, said utilities and all debt of the Grant County P.S.C.C. shall be its responsibility from its annual budget.

SECTION VII

The City of Williamstown will continue to operate the Grant County Dispatching Center as it is presently operated until such time as the Board of Directors for the Grant County Public Safety Communications Center have been appointed and until such time as two months receipts have been received from Cincinnati Bell Telephone Company pursuant to the tax hereinabove mentioned.

SECTION VIII

On the first day of first month following these events the City of Williamstown will turn over to the Board of Directors of the Grant County Public Safety Communications Center the operation of such Grant County Public Safety Communications Center and thereafter the operation of such Grant County Public Safety Communications Center shall be the responsibility of such Board of Directors with the City of Williamstown continuing to comply with Paragraphs 6 and 7 and consistent with the attached Inter-Governmental Agreement.

SECTION IX

The provisions of this ordinance are severable; and the invalidity of any provision of this ordinance shall not affect the validity of any other provision thereof; and such other provisions shall remain in full force and effect as long as they remain valid in the absence of those provisions determined to be invalid.

SECTION XI


All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict with the provisions of this ordinance are hereby repealed to the extent of such conflict.

SECTION XII


This ordinance shall be effective as soon as possible according to law.
