

ORDINANCE NO. 549-1996

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, FIXING AND ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARY AND COMPENSATION FOR THE OFFICE OF MAYOR OF THE CITY FOR THE TERM OF OFFICE BEGINNING THE 1ST DAY OF JANUARY 1999.

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge and environs have and are experiencing continuing growth which requires the city's mayor to expend increased time and effort to discharge the duties and responsibilities of office and attend to the business and needs of the city, all for which the said mayor should receive adequate and reasonable salary and compensation; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge has so determined that the salary and compensation now payable to and received by the city's mayor should be increased for the next elective term of office beginning on January 1, 1999, and hereby so provides for and fixes such increased salary and compensation for the elected office of Mayor of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE ONE

The base salary per annum for and of the Office of the Mayor of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, for the next elective term beginning on the 1st day of January, 1999, is hereby fixed and established at the sum and amount annual of TEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$10,000.00) to be received by and payable to the city's duly elected mayor in monthly installments under warrant drawn upon the city's treasury and funds during each calendar-year of the mayor's term of office.

ARTICLE TWO

Pursuant to KRS 83A.075(1) and (2), the mayor's annual salary in monies as hereinabove provided, shall be subject to an increase by the allowed and computed Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) of the Department of Local Government; and the Office of the Mayor of the City of Dry Ridge shall be entitled to have and receive compensation, in addition to the hereinabove provided annual salary in monies, as determined by the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge, to include but be not limited to, per diem compensation for travel and expenses, use of city-owned vehicle, use of city-owned credit card, and reimbursement for monies expended for and on behalf of the city.
