

ORDINANCE NO. 551-1997

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY,
LIMITING AND RESTRICTING VEHICULAR PARKING
ON A PORTION OF BROADWAY AND PROVIDING SANCTIONS
FOR VIOLATIONS THEREOF.

WHEREAS, Broadway is a city street and thoroughfare within the corporate limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, which is maintained, in part, by the city;

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, has experienced increased growth resulting in increased vehicular traffic and the use of its streets and thoroughfares, including Broadway, requiring the city to consider limiting and restricting vehicular use of the said city's streets and the rights-of-way thereof in order to insure proper traffic flow and to protect the health, safety, and welfare of the city's residents and others using the city's streets and rights-of-way thereof; and

WHEREAS, the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, has so found and determined that Broadway as to its existing pavement is too narrow to support two-way traffic with a planned turning lanes thereupon and, therefore the said street and its right-of-way must be restricted hereby.

BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

ARTICLE ONE

Definitions --

(1) As used herein, the term "Vehicle" means and includes: (a) All agencies for the transportation of persons or property over or upon the public highways of the Commonwealth of Kentucky or the streets of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and the rights-of-ways thereof; (b) All vehicles passing over or upon the highways or streets; (c) All vehicles propelled by any manner of muscular power; and (d) All vehicles propelled by power other than muscular power.

(2) As used herein, the term "Highway" means any public road, street, avenue, alley or boulevard, bridge, viaduct, or trestle, all rights-of-way thereto together with the approaches to them and includes off-street parking facilities offered for public use, whether publicly or privately owned.

ARTICLE TWO

Restrictions & Prohibitions --

(1) No vehicle shall be parked, stopped or allowed to stand upon the pavement, shoulder or right-of-way of Broadway from the said street's intersection with the westerly edge existing of U.S. Highway 25 (Main Street) to the said street's intersection with the easterly boundary line of the Waffle House property.

(2) No person shall stop, park or allow to stand any vehicle upon the pavement, shoulder or right of way of Broadway and to and from its due intersection with the westerly edge existing of U.S. Highway 25 (Main Street) to the said street's intersection with the easterly boundary line of the Waffle House property.

(3) Any vehicle so stopped, parked or standing upon the pavement, shoulder or right-of-way of Broadway within the course and boundary hereinabove provided, is so determined to be a nuisance and hazard to the detriment of the the public's health, safety and welfare and a dangerous condition impeding the proper use of the said street, and, therefore, the said vehicle shall be immediately removed therefrom using any lawful means.

ARTICLE THREE

Remedies & Sanctions --

(1) Any vehicle so stopped, parked or standing in violation of this ordinance shall be immediately towed away or removed by any lawful means with the owner and operator of such vehicle being liable for the costs and expenses of such removal, impound and storage.

(2) Persons violating this ordinance shall be prosecuted in the Grant District Court under Criminal Complaint or Uniform Citation and shall be fined not less than twenty dollars (\$20) nor more than one hundred dollars (\$100) for each offense plus court costs.
