Council for the City of Dry Ridge met in regular session on March 2, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. at the Dry Ridge City Building, 31 Broadway, Dry Ridge, Kentucky, 41035, with the following present:

Fred Money, Jason O'Nan, Kenny Edmondson, Karen Glore, Encil Webster, Jamie Webster, Cindy Harris, William and Donna Brown, Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins, Police Chief Rick Kells, Fire Chief Robert Bruin, Wastewater Superintendent Ken Little, Rex Benson, City Attorney Michael Mulvey, Phil Blevins, Devonda Munson, Wade Gutman, Jeff Shipp, and Mayor Clay Crupper.

Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris took attendance with all six Council present.

Mayor Crupper presented the agenda for approval.

Council member Jason O'Nan requested Garbage and Dumpsters be added as Item D. under New Business.

Council member Encil Webster requested Nuisance Ordinance be added as Item D. under Old Business.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Encil Webster seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of D. Nuisance Ordinance under Old Business and Item D. Garbage and Dumpsters under New Business. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

Mayor Clay Crupper presented the minutes of February 2, 2009 for Council approval.

Council member Karen Glore moved, Council member Jason O'Nan seconded to approve the minutes of February 2, 2009. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

## REPORTS

### FIRE

Chief Robert Bruin presented a copy of the letter awarding the City of Dry Ridge Fire Department a grant from FEMA for \$106,858(95%) with the total project cost of \$112,482 which the City funds 5% in the amount of \$5624. The grant will be used for an exhaust system for the Fire house and EMS equipment possibly the Auto Pulse and EMT training for the county.

## MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins stated beginning Wednesday the City Maintenance Department will dispose of limbs and brush from City residential streets.

## OLD BUSINESS

### A. PARKING ELLEN KAY DRIVE

Mayor Clay Crupper stated he talked with the Watkins and asked them to personally call him if there were anymore problems with parking on the street on Ellen Kay Drive. Mayor Crupper stated he would periodically drive and check Ellen Kay Drive different days at different times.

### B. AMBASSADOR DRIVE

Attorney Jeff Shipp addressed Council and Mayor Crupper concerning Ambassador Drive. He stated the grant can not be administered by private individuals. Jeff Shipp stated that once the grant is utilized completely and correctly then the grant will be closed. Jeff Shipp stated upon completion of the grant he will draft a "hold harmless agreement for the City". Jeff Shipp stated that KIA, who has the grant, and Division of Water, that controls water and wastewater, are two different entities that are like "railroad tracks that run parallel but never intersect" referencing the fact that the permit is under the City's name at KIA.

## NEW BUSINESS

### A. FIRST READING FY 2009 BUDGET AMENDMENT

Mayor Crupper recommended and requested that Council amend the FY 2009 Budget to include the Grant Fund for Ambassador Drive.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Kenny Edmondson seconded to amend the FY 2009 budget to include a Grant Fund for \$250,000. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-no, Jamie Webster-yes.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the first reading of the amended FY 2009 Budget.

### B. RESOLUTION FOR PAYMENT

City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the Resolution to pay NKADD and Hicks and Mann Engineering.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Jason O'Nan seconded to adopt the Resolution to pay NKADD and Hicks and Mann Engineering for work at the Ambassador Drive project. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-no, Jamie Webster-yes.

## OLD BUSINESS

### C. FIREWORKS

Mayor Crupper recognized Rex Benson, resident of Ellen Kay Drive and owner of Big Rex's Fireworks.

Rex Benson addressed Council again about a legal way for the City to administer seasonal sales specifically with regard to parking requirements.

Mayor Crupper, Council, and City Attorney Michael Mulvey had a discussion about seasonal sales, fireworks, and parking for seasonal sales.

Mayor Crupper asked City Attorney Michael Mulvey to advise Council how to permit seasonal sales, sale of fireworks, and the parking requirement issue with seasonal sales.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated Council would need to request a text amendment to even permit sale of fireworks because it was not listed as a permitted use.

Mayor Crupper instructed City Attorney Michael Mulvey to prepare and apply to Grant County Planning and Zoning Commission for a text amendment to include in permitted uses "the sale of fireworks".

City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated he was not sure just how to deal with the parking situation in the Zoning Ordinance.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Karen Glore seconded to apply for a text amendment for a listed, permitted use for fireworks sales under Neighborhood Commercial, Central Business, and Highway Commercial Zones and to amend the Zoning Ordinance to allow for a variation in parking for seasonal sales. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

### D. GENERAL NUISANCE

Council member Encil Webster asked about a Nuisance Ordinance such as the one Williamstown has.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris stated she had obtained Williamstown's Nuisance Ordinance and was waiting to be instructed to provide it to Council.

Cindy Harris stated she would provide copies of this ordinance to Council members prior to the next Council meeting.

### NEW BUSINESS

#### C. SIDEWALK GRANT RELOCATION.

Mayor Crupper stated he would meet with a representative of the Transportation Cabinet from District Six to ask for a relocation of the project from Warsaw Road for the high school to South Main from Advanced Auto Parts onto School Road to the elementary and middle schools.

Mayor Crupper stated he met again with representatives from the Transportation Cabinet and could not find a way to connect to the existing sidewalk without retaining walls. Mayor Crupper stated Jerry Ellis, 11 Ridgeview Drive (corner property Ridgeview Drive and Warsaw Road), does not want a retaining wall adjacent to his property.

Mayor Crupper discussed the students walking through Ridgeview Circle and installing a sidewalk through a side yard on Ridgeview Circle, but decided that would not work and the grant is for a sidewalk adjacent to a State route not a City street.


#### D. GARBAGE AND DUMPSTERS

Council member Jason O'Nani discussed what the City could do about dumpsters overflowing.

The suggestion was made that perhaps businesses might need to have their dumpsters emptied more often. The City does not contract for business waste collection or dumpster service.

#### ADJOURNMENT

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Kenny Edmondson seconded to adjourn at 7:55 p.m. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

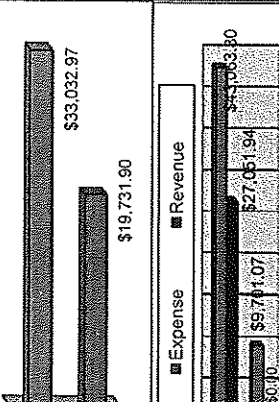

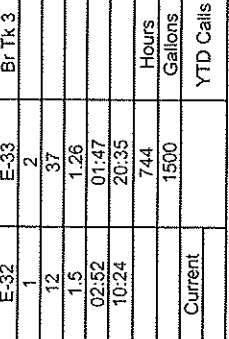

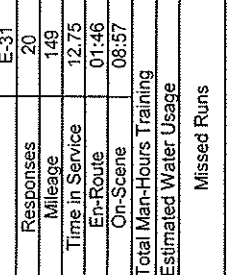
