Council for the City of Dry Ridge met in regular session on May 18, 2009, at 5:30 p.m. at the Dry Ridge City Building, 31 Broadway, Dry Ridge, Kentucky, 41035, with the following present:

Fred Money, Jason O'Nan, Kenny Edmondson, Karen Glore, Encil Webster, Jamie Webster-absent, Cindy Harris, Fire Chief Robert Bruin, Police Chief Rick Kells, Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins, Danny Synor, Greg Brockman, John and Shirley Renaker, City Attorney Michael Mulvey, and Mayor Clay Crupper.

Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris took attendance with five Council present and Council member Jamie Webster absent.

Council member Encil Webster moved, Council member Fred Money seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-absent.

Mayor Clay Crupper presented the minutes of May 4, 2009 for Council approval.

Council member Karen Glore moved, Council member Kenny Edmondson seconded to approve the minutes of May 4, 2009. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-absent.

## REPORTS

### POLICE

Chief Kells presented a written report. Attached.

### MAINTENANCE

Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins stated that he needed to install about 60 feet of drainpipe and repair the pavement on Michigan Avenue and also repair Dry Ridge Mt. Zion Road. Bobby Robbins stated he only had \$1990 for the line item street repair until July 1, 2009.

### FIRE

Chief Bruin had enclosed written reports in Council packets.

### NEW BUSINESS

#### D. APPROVAL FOR FIRE GRANT APPLICATION

Chief Bruin asked Council to approve two federal grants which the City would pay 5% and the federal grant would pay 95%, a turnout gear grant for \$64,917(\$61,671 grant and City \$3246) and a aerial ladder truck grant of \$750,000(\$37,500 City and \$712,500 federal grant).

Chief Bruin stated the NFPA have changed their regulations where turnout gear is not to be used after 15 years. Chief Bruin stated currently 4 new recruits have no turnout gear, 10 sets of gear are 10 years old, and 15 sets are 8 years old. Light destroys the gear. Some of the grant would be used for lockers to store the gear.

Chief Bruin stated the ladder truck is a 1974 and does not meet today's safety standards.

Mayor Crupper stated he recommended the City of Dry Ridge apply for both of these grants.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Encil Webster seconded to apply for both Federal grant \$64,917 for turnout gear and lockers and \$750,000 for an aerial ladder truck. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-absent.

#### CRUISE-IN

Mayor Crupper stated everything went well. The one vehicle "burning out" was about 15 minutes after the cruise-in was over.

C. FIRST READING FY BUDGET 2010 ORDINANCE 745-2009


City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the first reading of Ordinance 745-2009 FY 2010 Budget.

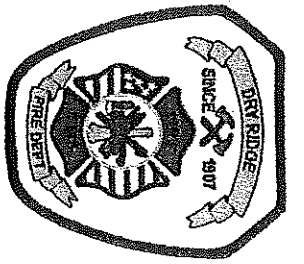
City Attorney Michael Mulvey read the first reading of Ordinance 746-2009 creating a text amendment for seasonal sales and the adjusted space for parking related thereto.
