MAY 4, 2009

Council for the City of Dry Ridge met in regular session on May 4, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. at the Dry Ridge City Building, 31 Broadway, Dry Ridge, Kentucky, 41035, with the following present:

Fred Money, Jason O'Nan, Kenny Edmondson, Karen Glore, Encil Webster, Jamie Webster, Cindy Harris, Brian Marshall-Grant County News, John and Shirley Renaker, City Attorney Michael Mulvey, , and Mayor Clay Crupper.

Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris took attendance with all six Council present.

Mayor Crupper requested that General Discussion be added under New Business to the agenda.

Council member Karen Glore moved, Council member Jason O'Nan seconded to approve the agenda with the addition of General Discussion under New Business as requested by Mayor Crupper. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

Mayor Clay Crupper presented the minutes of April 6, 2009 for Council approval.

Council member Encil Webster moved, Council member Jamie Webster seconded to approve the minutes of April 6, 2009 with corrections of legumes to lagoons. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

#### REPORTS

Mayor Crupper stated he instructed other City employees they did not need to attend.

Reports will be given at the next meeting.

Council asked about mowing and cleanup in particular the old Telestar property.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris stated mowing letters had been sent in March for mowing to begin in April. Cindy Harris stated three more mowing letters were sent today. Cindy Harris stated Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins had mowed two lawns on Race Street and billed the owners just this past Thursday. Cindy Harris stated the owner of Telestar did not sign for his certified letter. Council member Kenny Edmondson stated that his father would have a phone number for the owner. City Attorney Michael Mulvey stated the return of certified letter even unsigned, showed legal proof the City had attempted to notify the owner. Council discussed how to cleanup Telestar. No general consensus or time was concluded.

#### OLD BUSINESS

## NEW BUSINESS

### A. GENERAL DISCUSSION

Mayor Crupper stated he attended the Grant County Planning and Zoning Commission meeting last Monday. The City's request to amend the Zoning Ordinance to include seasonal sales and address the parking for such sales was approved. The City will receive the minutes from Grant County Planning and Zoning Commission meeting once the minutes are approved. The City Council should place this on the June 1, 2009, agenda. This should be completed before July 2009.

Mayor Crupper stated a budget meeting was held today with Council member Fred Money, Fire Chief Robert Bruin, Police Chief Rick Kells, Maintenance Superintendent Bobby Robbins, City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris and himself.

Mayor Crupper stated Chief Kells, Chief Bruin, Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris, Council members Fred Money and Encil Webster and himself would meet again Monday May 11<sup>th</sup> at 11:00 a.m.

Mayor Crupper stated another Council member was welcome to attend. Mayor Crupper stated Council could get copy of the original requests and working budget to date. City Clerk/Treasurer copied and provided this information.

Mayor Crupper instructed City Attorney Michael Mulvey to prepare annexation legal papers for the Scroggins property north of Blackburn and McCoy Lanes.


City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris asked Council to review pages 15 and 16 of the audit specifically the expenditure of \$253,004 more than revenues received with a loan for the ambulance received for \$137,100 relating to a net change in fund balance negatively of \$115,904 within the General Fund. The ending fund balance of \$554,500 consisted of \$354,879 in cash, due from Utility Fund net of \$61,324, and the remainder was various taxes receivable, prepaid insurance less accounts payable and liabilities as of June 30, 2008. City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris also mentioned that the current FY 2009 budget shows expenditures in the General Fund of \$302,653 over projected revenues. City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris stated that all departments are making every effort to trim budgets to the bare essentials to stay within the revenues projected as closely as possible. There probably is no way to trim budgets any further without cutting some services.

John Renaker was recognized by Mayor Crupper. John Renaker asked about a fence permit and was advised to contact the Zoning Official Bobby Robbins.

Mayor Crupper stated the 2<sup>nd</sup> year of the Cruise In would begin Saturday, May 9, 2009. The location of the "registration/office" will be more centrally located near the intersection of US 25/Broadway rather than on Broadway at Donna's Little Shrimp, which was last year's official location.
