Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris took attendance with five Council members being present. Jamie Webster was unable to attend.

Mayor Clay Crupper presented the minutes of October 25, 2010 for approval.

## REPORTS

### FIRE

Fire Chief Robert Bruin stated the Fire Symposium would be held January 15 and 16, 2011.

Chief Bruin stated the old radios would not work on the new system. The grant only supplied the number of radios per seats on the department's apparatus which is 31. Dry Ridge needs 40 radios. Chief Bruin stated he could get some allowance for the old radios with trade in for purchase of the new radios but would need Council to declare this as surplus property so he could do so.

This will be on the agenda for December meeting.

Chief Bruin recognized Dewayne Hammons for 30 years of volunteer service to the City of Dry Ridge Fire Department.

Council thanked and commended Dewayne Hammons on his dedication for his 30 years in volunteering on the Dry Ridge City Fire Department.

## OLD BUSINESS

### A. ALCOHOL/DRUG FREE POLICY

Asst. Chief Joe Jamison stated Mayor Crupper, Fire Chief Robert Bruin, Police Chief Rick Kells, and himself wanted one change to the Drug/Alcohol Free Workplace Policy made which would change the current 4 hours to 8 hours. No consumption of any alcohol should occur 8 hours or less before an employee should report to work and/or operate city equipment or motor vehicles.

This policy will reduce our workers' compensation premiums and will clearly permit pre-employment, post accident, reasonable suspicion, and random testing. The City currently tests for everything except random testing.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Karen Glore seconded to adopt the more restrictive policy of at least an 8 hour window before reporting to work in the Alcohol/Drug Free Workplace Policy. Motion carried. Judy Curry-yes, Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-absent.


#### B. SIDEWALK GRANT
