NEW BUSINESS


A. USAGE OF PROPERTY 149 SOUTH MAIN STREET (FOOD BANK DISTRIBUTION)-DENNIS NORTHCUTT

Mayor Crupper introduced Dennis Northcutt. Mr. Northcutt stated that he was interested in purchasing the property located at 149 South Main Street to be used as a food bank distribution. He also wanted to make clear this would be similar to the free food bank in Cincinnati Ohio and not a homeless shelter. Mr. Northcutt said he understood that the property would have to be re-zoned to highway commercial. He stated that in the future he would like to expand the building into a community facility similar to a YMCA. Mr. Northcutt passed out packets to Council so they would have information about what he wanted to do with the property. Mr. Northcutt stated that Larry Spears and Rick Rose had agreed to sell both properties at 149 South Main Street for one million dollars. He also wanted the Council to know that he is still working on paperwork with the state.

Council member Encil Webster asked about the Nuisance ordinance. Mayor Crupper said it would be on the agenda for April 6, 2009.
