Council for the City of Dry Ridge met in regular session on August 3, 2009, at 7:00 p.m. at the Dry Ridge City Building, 31 Broadway, Dry Ridge, Kentucky, 41035, with the following present:

Mayor Crupper called the meeting to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Crupper welcomed our guests.

City Clerk/Treasurer Cindy Harris took attendance with all six Council present.

Mayor Crupper presented the agenda for approval.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Encil Webster seconded to approve the agenda. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.

Mayor Clay Crupper presented the minutes of July 6, 2009 for Council approval.

REPORTS

FIRE

Fire Chief Robert Bruin stated the EMT class would start tonight with 27 enrolled, 15 being local fire fighters. Chief Bruin stated one half of our grant money had been received. Chief Bruin stated hopefully the firehouse exhaust system, which was funded by grant money, would be completed this week. Monthly reports attached.

Mayor Clay Crupper discussed the complaints received about the dirt bike track on Taft Highway near Ellen Kay Drive.

NEW BUSINESS

A. RESOLUTION LOAN WILLIAMSTOWN WASTE WATER TREATMENT PLANT

Mayor Crupper stated the Ken Little and himself met with Mayor Caldwell and Quest Engineering on July 14, 2009 to discuss the sewer plant and sewer issues. Mayor Crupper stated the time was almost out for the City of Williamstown to borrow at 1% interest for the proposed sewer plant. Mayor Crupper stated that the City of Williamstown needed a Resolution in support of the 1% loan from KIA for building the new proposed sewer plant.

City Attorney Michael Mulvey had talked with Jeff Shipp, attorney for the City of Williamstown, but had not prepared a Resolution.

Mayor Crupper asked Council to go ahead and pass a Resolution and for City Attorney Michael Mulvey to prepare the document as soon as possible before the City of Williamstown's time ran out.

Council agreed to pass the Resolution before it was drafted provided it only stated the City of Dry Ridge was in support of the City of Williamstown borrowing at 1% from KIA to construct the proposed sewer treatment plant and the City of Dry Ridge would continue to be an ongoing customer. Council stated the City of Dry Ridge was not agreeing to any fees or charges.

Council member Fred Money moved, Council member Jamie Webster seconded to adopt a Resolution in support of the City of Williamstown's 1% loan from KIA to construct the proposed sewer treatment plant and to continue to be an ongoing customer only. No fees or charges are to be included. Motion carried. Kenny Edmondson-yes, Karen Glore-yes, Fred Money-yes, Jason O'Nan-yes, Encil Webster-yes, Jamie Webster-yes.


B. GRANT COUNTY PLANNING AND ZONING APPOINTMENT

Mayor Crupper stated Brooke Rider had resigned from the Grant County Planning and Zoning Commission. Mayor Crupper appointed Dr. Clay Parks and asked Council to approve the appointment.
