

An ordinance proposing to annex to the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, certain unincorporated territory lying in Grant County, Ky., and adjoining the corporate limits of said City, and accurately describing the boundary of the territory proposed to be annexed.

Be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the City of Dry Ridge, Grant County, Kentucky.

Section 1. That it is hereby deemed advisable and it is hereby proposed to annex to the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, all the unincorporated territory lying in Grant County, Kentucky, and adjoining the corporate limits of said City describing by metes and bounds, as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the old corporation line of the south school line 200 ft. west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a southerly direction on a line parallel with the west line of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway 1461 feet to a point in King's and Eckler's line, said point is 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a westerly direction 710 feet to another point in King's and Eckler's line, thence in a southerly direction 344 feet to a point in King's property; thence in an easterly direction 714 feet to a point 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a southerly direction and parallel with the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway 1463 feet to a point in the Grant County Board of Education property, formerly Ruben Taylor's property, said point is north west of the Southern Railroad Crossing and south of the residence of the property of the Grant County Board of Education; said point is also 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in an easterly direction, crossing the Dixie Highway and Southern Railroad 452 feet to a point in R. D. Hogan's property on the east side of the Southern Railroad right-of-way, said point is 150 feet east of the east line of the Southern Railroad right-of-way, thence in a northerly direction parallel with the east line of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad 2010 feet to a point 200 feet south of the center line of the Broad Ridge and Knoxville pike, said point is in the Claude Flynn property, thence in an easterly direction parallel with the center line of the Broad Ridge and Knoxville pike 600 feet, to a point in R. D. Hogan's property, thence in a northerly direction 650 feet to a point in the north corner of the Floyd Jump property and a corner to R. H. Stephenson, thence in a westerly direction 662 feet to a point in R. H. Stephensons' and A. F. Lucas' line, said point is 200 feet east of the east line of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad, thence in a northerly direction 660 feet to a point in R. H. Stephenson's and Roy Fortner's line, said point is 200 feet east of the east line of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad, thence west 50 feet to a point in the old corporation line in R. H. Stephenson's and Roy Fortner's line.

Lines and lengths of the above are more or less.

Section 2. This ordinance shall be posted (or copies of the same) for at least ten (10) days in four of the most public places in the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and also published in the County paper for four (4) issues.

ORDINANCE NO. 107 (CONTINUED)

Section 3. After the expiration of thirty (30) days from the enactment of the ordinance, and after same shall have been published as is provided in Section Two hereof, if no petition shall have been filed in the Grant County Circuit Court setting forth reasons why the territory defined in Section One of this Ordinance shall not be annexed to the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, the Board of Trustees will enact an ordinance annexing to the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, the territory defined in Section One of this Ordinance, and upon the enactment of such Ordinance, the aforesaid territory shall be annexed to the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and become a part thereof.

Section 4. This ordinance shall take effect when signed and recorded and published as required by law.

Ordinance annexing territory provided for in
Ordinance 107 , on pages 32 & 33

Enactment of Ordinance #107 and amended Ordinance #107 as follows-

Said enactment of ordinance having resulted in a legal suit to deny said enactment and said suit having been decided by the Grant Circuit Court of Williamstown, Ky. in favor of the City of Dry Ridge, Ky. annexing said territory to city and said judgment having been certified to the Board of Trustees by the Circuit Court Clerk.

Now therefore be it ordained by the Board of Trustees of the City of Dry Ridge, Ky.

Section 1. That it is hereby deemed advisable and it is hereby annexed to the City of Dry Ridge, Ky., all the unincorporated territory lying in Grant County, Ky. and adjoining the corporated limits of said city described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit:

Beginning at a point in the old corporation line of the south school line 200 ft. west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a southerly direction on a line parallel with the west line of the right- of-way of the Dixie Highway, 1461 feet to a point in King's and Eckler's line, said point is 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a westerly direction 710 feet to another point in Kings and Ecklers line, thence in a southerly direction 344 feet to a point in King's property, thence in a easterly direction 714 feet to a point 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in a southerly direction and parallel with the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway 1463 feet to a point in the Grant County Board of Education property, formerly Ruben Taylor's property, said point is northwest of the Southern Railway Crossing, and south of the residence on the property of the Grant County Board of Education, said point is also 200 feet west of the west side of the right-of-way of the Dixie Highway, thence in an easterly direction crossing the Dixie Highway and the Southern Railroad

452 feet to a point in R. D. Hogan's property on the east side of the Southern Railroad right-of-way, said point is 150 feet east of the east line of the Southern Railroad right-of-way, thence in a northerly direction parallel with the east line of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad 2010 feet to a point 200 feet south of the center line of the Broad Ridge and Knoxville pike, said point is in the Claud Flynn property, thence in a easterly direction parallel with the center line of the Broad Ridge and Knoxville pike 600 feet to a point in R. D. Hogan's property, thence in a northerly direction 650 feet to a point in the north corner of Floyd Jupp property and a corner to R. H. Stephenson, thence in a westerly direction 682 feet to a point in R. H. Stephenson and A. F. Lucas line, said point is 200 feet east of the east side of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad, thence in a northerly direction 660 feet to a point in R. H. Stephenson and Roy Fortner line, said point is 200 feet east of the east line of the right-of-way of the Southern Railroad, thence in a westerly direction 50 feet to a point in the old corporation line in R. H. Stephenson's and Roy Fortner's line.

Lines and lengths of the above are more or less.

Section 2. Upon the enactment of this ordinance and the Grant County Circuit Court's approval of same. The aforesaid territory is now annexed to the City of Dry Ridge, Ky. and becomes a part thereof.
