

ORDINANCE NO. 126

An ordinance to repeal Ordinance No. 120 and to provide for the Inoculation of Dogs against Rabies.

Whereas, the Board of Trustees of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, deeming it necessary and in the best interest of its residents, do ordain as follows:

Ordinance No. 120 is hereby repealed upon the passage of the following ordinance:

Any persons or person having in their possession or control in the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, a dog or dogs, shall have them regularly inoculated against rabies so as to provide continuous protection against infection by Rabies.

The Town Marshall shall at least every six months, inspect the rabies inoculation certificates of all dogs, confined or not confined, within the corporate limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, to

determine if such dogs are currently inoculated against Rabies. Should any owner or possessor of any dog or dogs fail to show satisfactory proof to the Town Marshall that their dog or dogs are not inoculated against rabies, then the said owner or possessor shall have no longer than ten (10) days to have said dog or dogs inoculated against rabies, and said dog or dogs shall be confined during the ten (10) day period.

The Town Marshall shall upon his inspection at each six months keep a record of all dogs within the corporate limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and such record shall indicate whether or not said dog or dogs are inoculated against rabies and also at the expiration of the ten (10) day period shall again make an inspection to determine if said dog or dogs are not inoculated.

The Town Marshall shall destroy any unlicensed dog or dogs within the corporate limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and shall be allowed a fee of \$1.00 out of the general tax fund for each dog destroyed.

The owner or possessor who violates any provision of this ordinance shall be cited to the Police Judge of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and upon conviction thereof, shall be fined not less than \$10.00 and the dog or dogs destroyed, and each day of violation after said citation, shall constitute a separate offense.
