AN ORDINANCE FIXING TRE COMPENSATION OF MEMBERS OF THE LEGISLATEVE BODY: THE CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER AND CERTAIN OFFICIALS AND EMPLOYEES OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, certain additional duties and obligations have been placed on members of the Legislative Body, the chief executive officer and certain officials and employees;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

Section 1. That each duly elected member of the Legislative Body, except the chief executive of the city, of the city of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, be and the same are hereby ordered to receive as compensation for their services the sum of FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) for each meeting of aforesaid Legislative body, either regular, special, adjourned, or not adjurned, attended by said member. This section applies only to members of the Legislative body taking office on or after January 1st, 1953. Said compensation shall be paid annually at the last regular meeting of each calendar year.

Section 2. The duly elected Chief Executive Officer of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, be and is hereby ordered and directed to receive as compensation for his services the sum of SEVEN DOLLARS (\$7.00) for each meeting of the City Legislative Body, eigher regular, special, adjourned, or not adjourned, attended by said chief executive officer. This section applies only to those as chief executive officers taking office on or after January 1st, 1953; said compensation shall be paid annually at the end of each calendar year.

Section 3. The duly acting Clerk of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, shall receive THREE DOLLARS (\$3.00) for each meeting of the City Legislative Body attended, be it regular, special, adjourned or nott adjourned. The said Clerk shall further receive the sum of SEVENTY-FIVE CENTS(\$.75) for each license, permit, or similiar instrument issued by him under the laws of and applicable to said City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, the duly acting treasurer of the City of Dry Ridge shall receive FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) for each meeting attended, be it regular, special, adjourned, or not adjourned. The Offices of Clerk and Treasurer shall be held by one and the same person unless otherwise directed by the City Degislative Body. The total compensation received under this section shall in no event exceed SIX HUNDRED DOLLARS (\$500.00) annually. This section shall be effective on and after January 1st, 1952. All of said compensation shall be paid annually at the last regular meeting in each calendar year.

Section 4. The duly acting Town Marshall or Policemen shall receive as compensation for their services the sum of SEVENTY FIVE DOLIARS (\$75.00) per month. In addition, said Marshall or Policemen shall receive the sum of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) for each stray dog or dogs destroyed by him; the sum of ONE DOLLAR (\$1.00) for each arrest of a non-resident of the City of Bry Ridge violating any license, permit, or similar provisions of any ordinance of said city; and the sum of TWO DOLLARS (\$2.00) for any other arrest to be paid by the guilty party upon conviction and to be taxed against said party as part of the court costs. This section shall be effective on and after January lst, 1952. Said compensation shall be paid monthly at each regular meeting after the month in which the services are performed.

ORDINANCE NO. 137 (CONTINUED)

Section 5. The duly elected Police Judge shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of FOUR DOLLARS AND FIFTY CENTS (\$4.50) for each trial or hearing in the Police Court of said City attended and presided over by him, said sum to be assessed as costs upon conviction, or if no conviction is had, said sum to be paid from the general funds of said City. In the event the duly elected Judge is unable to serve the same provisions shall apply to the duly appointed Judge propem who shall act in his absence. his section shall be effective on and after January 1st, 1952. Said compensation shall be paid monthly at each regular meeting immediately after the monthin which the services were rendered.

Section 6. The duly acting City Attorney shall receive as compensation for his services the sum of FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) for each meeting attended, be it regular, special, adjourned, or not adjourned. The shall also receive the sum of FIVE DOLLARS (\$5.00) for each case or hearing in the Police Court of said City attended and prosecuted by him to be assessed as costs against the guilty party upon conviction. He shall also recieve 30% of all fines and forfeitures paid in said Police Court. Said City attorney shall further receive a reasonable fee for any additional legal work done at the request of and for said City. This section shall be effective on and afterJanuary 1st. 1952.

Section 7. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conp. flict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.
