## ORDINANCE NO. 14

That there shall be a continuous side walk on the east side of Main Street on the Covington and Lexington turn pike road, in the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, from J.W. Gardner's store to the northern corporate limits of said Town; also on the west side of said Main Street from the southern corporate limits of said Town. That it shall be the duty of each and every person or persons owning property fronting, adjoining or abutting upon Main Street of the said Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, upon either side of the said street between the points above described; and, that within ninety (90) days from the date hereof to construct a concrete side walk in front of his/her or their property or lot making suitable and proper connections with the side walk built or to be built by his/her or their neighbors upon either side of them.

Said concrete walks shall be built or constructed not less than four (4) feet wide and not less than one (1) foot or twelve (12) inches in depth, as follows (wiz); Not less than eight (8) inches of bed stone (which shall be coarse stone) and not less than four (4) inches of grouting and top dressing. Said grouting shall consist of finely broken stone (or grove) properly mixed with proper proportions of clean sand and good grade of portland cement. The said top finish shall consist of not less than one (1) inch in depth, and made from clean sand and good grade of portland cement mixed in proper proportions and well laid and finished in a careful workman like manner.

That all of the material and work in the construction of the above ordered side walks shall be subject to the approval of the Board of Trustees of the said Town. That all the walks not so built on or before the \_\_\_\_\_ day of October 1911, shall then be built or ordered built by the said Board of Trustees and all of the cost thereof levied against the property when built, and collected the same as Town taxes or by law permitted to be collected.
