

ORDINANCE NO. 141

AN ORDINANCE AUTHORIZING AND DIRECTING THE CITY ATTORNEY OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY TO INSTITUTE AN ACTION FOR THE CLOSING OF A 10 FOOT ALLEY OR PASSWAY IN THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY.

WHEREAS, heretofore John W. Renaker has petitioned the Board of Trustees of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, to close a certain alley or passway lying and being adjacent to his lot in the City of Dry Ridge and,

WHEREAS, said John W. Renaker has made suitable provisions for the opening of another passway to take the place of the one to be closed and has agreed to pay all expenses of the closing of said alley or passway.

NOW THEREFORE THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE DO ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. That the City Attorney be and he is hereby authorized and directed to institute an action in the Grant Circuit Court for the closing of a 10 foot alley or passway in the City of Dry Ridge running as follows:

Beginning at a point in the Southeast corner of J.W. Renaker's land (Garage lot) and corner corner to U.S. Highway #25; thence in a Southwesterly direction with the line of J.W. Renaker (Garage) lot a distance of 180 feet to a point corner

to J.W. Renaker and the passway now on the land of J.P. Blair, Mildred Blair, and Andrew McGee; thence in a South-easterly direction a distance of 10 feet in a line parallel to U.S. Highway #25 to a point corner to J.W. Renaker (service station) lot; thence with the line of this lot in a Northeasterly direction a distance of 180 feet to a point corner to this lot and U.S. Highway #25; thence in a North-westerly direction with a line of U.S. Highway #25 a distance of 10 feet to the point of beginning; This being the same passway as shown on the plat of J.W. Glovers land made by Ben L. Vallandingham, surveyor, February 24th, 1920, and recorded in Deed Book 39 at page 28 of the records of the Grant County Court Clerk's Office, Williamstown, Kentucky,

and said City Attorney is directed to take all steps necessary for the closing of said alley or passway.

SECTION II. All ordinance or parts of ordinance in conflict herewith are to the extent of such conflict hereby repealed.

SECTION III. This ordinance to be in full force and effect on and after its passage and publication as required by law.
