

ORDINANCE NO. 188

AN ORDINANCE PROHIBITING THE PARKING OR
STANDING OF MOTOR VEHICLES OR OTHER VEHICLES
ON THE PORTION OF THE PAVEMENT NORMALLY USED
FOR VEHICULAR TRAVEL OR TRAFFIC OF ALL CITY
STREETS EXCEPT BROADWAY AND MAIN STREET.

WHEREAS, the safety, health, and welfare of the citizens of
Dry Ridge, Kentucky, are being endangered by the unrestricted parking of
motor vehicles on all city streets, except Broadway and Main Street, and

WHEREAS, this council is desirous of eliminating such dangers.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE,
KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: No person, firm, or corporation shall permit any motor vehicle
or other vehicle owned, or used by it, or him, to be parked or to stand
on that portion of the pavement of any city street normally used for
vehicular travel or traffic.

SECTION II: FOR THE purposes of this ordinance the term "portion normally
used for vehicular travel or traffic" shall mean the entire paved portion
of all city streets.

SECTION III: This ordinance shall not, however, apply to Main Street and Broadway.

SECTION IV: All ordinances, resolutions, or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION V: If any section, paragraph, or clause of this ordinance be held to be invalid, by any proper court, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining section, paragraphs, or clauses, it being hereby expressly declared that the remainder of this ordinance would have been passed such invalidity.

SECTION VI: Any person, firm, or corporation found guilty of violating any of the provisions of this ordinance shall be fined a sum of not less than THREE DOLLARS (\$3.00) nor more than TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00).
