ORDINANCE NO. 193

AN ORDINANCE REGULATING THE VEHICULAR TRAVEL AND TRAFFIC ON WALNUT, CROSS AND SCHOOL STREETS BY THE MAKING OF SAID STREETS OPEN FOR ONE WAY TRAFFIC ONLY.

WHEREAS, it has been determined by this Council that it is in the best interest of the health, safety and welfare of the general public and of the citizens of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, that certain traffic regulations be made on Walnut Street, Cross Street and School Street in the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky.

NOW, THEREFORE, THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I: That from and after the effective date of this Ordinance no person shall operate or permit to be operated any vehicle on Walnut Street, Cross Street or School Street in the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, in any direction of travel other than west on Walnut Street, south on Cross Street and east on School Street. Said streets are hereby declared to be open only to traffic going "One Way" and in the above stated directions on the above stated streets.

SECTION II: Any person, firm or corporation found guilty of violating any provision of this ordinance shall be fined a sum of not less than THREE DOLLARS (\$3.00) nor more than TEN DOLLARS (\$10.00).

SECTION III: All ordinances, resolutions or parts thereof in conflict herewith are, to the extent of such conflict, hereby repealed.

SECTION IV: If any paragraph, section or clause of this ordinance be declared to be invalid by a proper court, such invalidity shall not affect the remaining sections, paragraphs or clauses. It being hereby expressly declared that same would have been passed despite such invalidity. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after its passage and publication as required by law.
