ORDINANCE NO. 441-1989

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE ESTABLISHING AND INCREASING THE RATE AND CHARGE FOR WATER DISPENSED AT THE LOADING STATION LOCATED BY THE CITY BUILDING AT 31 BROADWAY, DRY RIDGE, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE:

Section One

The rate and charge present of One Dollar and Seventy-Five Cents (\$1.75) for each one thousand (1,000) gallons of water dispensed at the City's Water Station located adjacent to the Dry Ridge City Building be and hereby is increased and so established at the rate and charge of Two Dollars and Fifty Cents (\$2.50) for each one thousand (1,000) gallons of water dispensed. All so done and required to pay and defray the costs and expenses of maintaining the loading station, equipment, site and equipment including the new concrete drive recently installed, and to so further pay and defray the added cost of water to and purchased by the City of Dry Ridge under its contract with the City of Williamstown to increase in May of 1989.

Section Two

This ordinance and the new rate established and set hereunder is to be effective on April 1, 1989, and is emmediately required to pay and defray the said accumulated costs and expenses noted above and to meet and pay the second increase in the cost of water supplied to and purchased by the City of Dry Ridge from the City of Williamstown effective in May of 1989.

Section Three

The Mayor and the City's Chief Maintenance Supervisor having advised and both declared an emergency to exist so that the metering equipment necessary to effect the increased rate and charge can be acquired and installed by 1 April 1989 in time to collect the added and necessary charges and revenues from the sales of water to customers using the City's Water Station, all to which the Dry Ridge City Council did so concur and agree as to the existence of an emergency situation requiring the suspension of two separate readings of this ordinance as permitted by KRS 83A. 060(7), Councilperson George Hedges moved that an emergency be deemed to exist so as to dispense with the requirement of two separate readings of this ordinance on two separate days, which motion was seconded by Councilperson James Middleton, and following a discussion of the matter, the vote on the motion was as follows: Councilperson James E. Jump -- Absent; Councilperson Omer Vest -- Aye; Councilperson James 30 Middleton -- Aye; Councilperson George Hedges -- Aye; Councilperson Darlene West --Aye: and Councilperson Vernon Webster -- Aye. The foregoing tally and vote in the affirmative was announced and declared by the Mayor and further stated to be in excess of two-thirds of the entire City Council as required by KRS 83A.060(7).
