

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY CONCERNING THE ESTABLISHMENT OF AN E911 EMERGENCY TELEPHONE SERVICE SYSTEM.

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge is of the opinion that it would be in the best interest of its citizens and residents to provide for a more efficient means to dispatch emergency services through an E911 Emergency Telephone System;

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge believes that the establishment of an E911 emergency telephone service system would enhance the general health, welfare and safety of all citizens and residents within the incorporated limits of the city; and

WHEREAS, the City of Dry Ridge is empowered by the provisions of KRS 65.760 to establish an E911 emergency telephone service system and further enter into an inter-local agreement with other units and subunits of government concerning such emergency telephone service system.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:

1. That there shall be established within the incorporated limits of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky an E911 emergency telephone service system conditioned upon the same being likewise established within all remaining areas of Grant County, Kentucky, both incorporated and unincorporated;

2. That funds necessary for the establishment and continued operation of said emergency telephone service system shall be derived from charges to be collected from local telephone subscribers in the entire area to be serviced by the E911 emergency telephone service system on an individual exchange line basis limited to a maximum of twenty-five (25) lines per account together with all permitted and legal means of finance, including the levy of any appropriate and permitted tax;

3. That all revenues from line charges, tax or fees levied to fund the E911 emergency telephone service system shall be expended solely for the purpose of funding an E911 emergency telephone service system and for no other purpose;


4. That any participating governmental body/principal-member-unit under the inter-local agreement anticipated hereby, may apply for and accept state, federal and other grant monies, contributions and donations from any legal source for the purpose of so funding the E911 emergency telephone service system; and


5. That the actual day to day operations of the E911 telephone service system shall be governed by regulations to be adopted pursuant to this Ordinance and to the inter-local Agreement hereby contemplated and forthcoming between and among the County of Grant and the cities of Corinth, Crittenden, Dry Ridge and Williamstown.
