

**ORDINANCE NO. 690-2006**

AN ORDINANCE OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, FIXING AND ESTABLISHING THE ANNUAL SALARY AND COMPENSATION FOR THE ELECTED OFFICE OF MAYOR OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE FOR THE TERM OF OFFICE BEGINNING IN JANUARY OF 2007.

**WHEREAS**, the City of Dry Ridge and environs have and are experiencing continuing growth which requires the city's mayor to expend increasing time and effort to discharge the duties and responsibilities of office and to attend to the business and needs of the city, all for which the said mayor should receive an adequate and reasonable salary and compensation; and

**WHEREAS**, the City Council of the City of Dry Ridge has so determined that the salary and compensation now payable to and received by the city's mayor should be increased for the next elective term of office beginning in January of 2007, and hereby so provides for and fixes such new and said salary and compensation for the elected office of Mayor of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, as hereinafter provided.

**BE IT HEREBY ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, AS FOLLOWS:**

**GENERAL ARTICLE**

Pursuant to KRS 83A.070(1) and KRS 83A.075(2), the salary and compensation for the elected office of Mayor of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, for the next elective term of office beginning in January of 2007, is hereby fixed and established at the sum and amount annual of EIGHTEEN THOUSAND DOLLARS (\$18,000.00) subject thereafter to any adjustment or increase allowed and computed as a Cost of Living Adjustment (COLA) by the Governor's Office of Local Government together with an additional allowance by per diem or out-of-pocket expenses made or incurred due to travel and expenses for mandatory or extraordinary activities done for and on behalf of the city.
