MAYOR'S REPORT

FIRE DEPARTMENT

Fire Chief Rodney Smith presented the January stats report.

Chief Smith informed council Jason Nantz retired from the Dry Ridge Fire Department and Georgetown Fire Department at the end of January after 27 years of service.

Council Member Ashley Brinker asked if work on the fire house had begun. Chief Smith stated it had not, but they have moved people out of the bunk house. Mayor Brockman stated they will start on the bunkroom tomorrow.

POLICE DEPARTMENT
