

ORDINANCE NO. 225

AN ORDINANCE PROPOSING TO ANNEX CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY LYING IN GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AND BEING ADJACENT AND CONTIGUOUS TO THE PRESENT CORPORATE LIMITS OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, AND ACCURATELY DESCRIBING THE BOUNDRY OF THE TERRITORY TO BE ANNEXED.

WHEREAS, the Board of Trustees, City of Dry Ridge, Grant County, Kentucky, has determined that it is desirable and advantageous for the City of Dry Ridge to annex certain territory contiguous to the present corporate limits, and that the failure to so annex the aforesaid contiguous territory will materially retard the growth and future prosperity of the City;

NOW, THEREFORE, THE BOARD OF TRUSTEES OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, GRANT COUNTY, KENTUCKY, DOES ORDAIN AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I

That the Board of Trustees does hereby propose to annex and to make a part of the City of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, the following described territory lying adjacent and contiguous to the present corporate limits of said City;

Beginning at a corner point in the present city corporate limits on the line between the property of W. O. Blackburn and the right of way for Interstate 75, thence westerly across the interstate highway, a county road and the lands of Byron Cull, 2870' more or less to a property corner of Murphey Hudson; thence along the north property line of Murphey Hudson S72 $\frac{1}{2}$ °W 940' more or less to a point in the Mt. Zion and Dry Ridge Pike; thence southwesterly across the land of C. B. Martin along a small creek 1050' more or less to another creek and the property of Vernon J. Ashcraft; thence across the land of Vernon J. Ashcraft in a southwesterly direction 650' more or less to a point on the south side of State Road No. 467 (Warsaw Road) at another property line of Vernon J. Ashcraft; thence southwesterly along the property line of Vernon J. Ashcraft, 1000' more or less to a point; thence leaving said property line and crossing the land of

Vernon J. Ashcraft southeasterly 1000' more or less to another point on the property line of Vernan J. Ashcraft; thence continuing in a southeasterly direction and along said property line 500' more or less to the northeast corner of a lot, the property of Emery Whaley; thence southerly along east property line of said lot 350' more or less to the north side of a State Road No. 22 (Taft Highway); thence westerly along north right of way line of said highway 450' more or less to a point opposite the property line of E. C. Gibson and Mildred Colcord; thence southerly along said property line 1300' more or less to a point; thence crossing the property of E. C. Gibson and Mildred Colcord easterly 2350' more or less to a common corner with Wilbur Stith and Hicks Chipman; thence northwardly along the line between the lands of E. C. Gibson and Mildred Colcord and Wilbur Stith and crossing the aforementioned Taft Highway 2400' more or less to the end of the property line between lands of the aforementioned parties; thence northeasterly along the north property line of Wilbur Stith 800' more or less, southeasterly 275' more or less, northeasterly 350' more or less to a point on the present corporate limits of the City of Dry Ridge; thence northwest, northeast, southeast and northwardly along the present corporation line as it meanders back to the place of beginning.

SECTION II

That this Ordinance shall be published in the "Grant County News", a weekly newspaper, for four consecutive weekly issues and that copies of this Ordinance shall be posted for at least ten consecutive days in four of the most public places throughout the City.

SECTION III

If after the expiration of thirty (30) days from the enactment of this Ordinance, no petition has been filed in the Grant County Court protesting the said proposal of annexation, the Board of Trustees shall enact an Ordinance annexing the aforescribed territory to the City of Dry Ridge and upon the enactment of said Ordinance, the aforescribed territory shall be annexed to and become a part of the City of Dry Ridge.

SECTION IV

This Ordinance shall take effect and be in full force and effect when passed, approved and published as required by law.
