

AN ORDINANCE CALLING FOR A VOTE BY THE
THE CITIZENS OF DRY RIDGE UPON THE FOLLOWING QUESTION
SHALL THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT TAX OF EIGHT CENTS PER
HUNDRED DOLLARS OF ASSESSED VALUATION, EXPIRING IN
1972, BE REDUCED TO SIX CENTS PER HUNDRED DOLLARS OF
ASSESSED VALUATION AND CONTINUED FOR TEN YEARS TO
FINANCE MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS IN DRY RIDGE?

WHEREAS, the progressive-minded citizens of Dry Ridge have heretofore voted for Capital Improvement tax of eight cents per hundred dollars of assessed valuation, and

WHEREAS, THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE has thereby been able to construct a new city building and fire house, and

WHEREAS additional Capital Improvements are vitally needed in the City of Dry Ridge, now therefore

THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE, KENTUCKY, does ordain as follows:

SECTION I

That the will of the Citizens of Dry Ridge be determined on the following question: SHALL THE CAPITAL IMPROVEMENT TAX OF EIGHT CENTS PER HUNDRED DOLLARS ASSESSED VALUATION, EXPIRING IN 1972, BE REDUCED TO SIX CENTS PER HUNDRED DOLLARS OF ASSESSED VALUATION AND CONTINUED FOR TEN YEARS TO FINANCE MUNICIPAL IMPROVEMENTS IN DRY RIDGE?

SECTION II

That this question be submitted to the electorate for a yes or no vote at the time of the regular election in November, 1971.

SECTION III shall be in full force and effect from its passage and publication as required by law.
