ORDINANCE NO. 64

The Board of Trustees of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky. in regular session for business on Tuesday night, June 7, 1932, do ordain as follows:

SECTION 1. That all owners of property within the

corporate limits of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, or person in possession or control of such property, be required to cut at once and keep cut all weeds, tall grass and bushes along his or her respective part or parts of such sidewalks, public streets and alleys as join or abut his or her property.

SECTION 2. That all owners of vacant lots within the corporate limits of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, or person in possession or control of such property, be required to cut at once the weeds, tall grass, and unsightly bushes and keep such vacant lots free of such weeds, tall grass and unsightly bushes at all times.

SECTION 3. That the owners of property within the corporate limits of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, or the person in possession or control of such property, which joins or abuts on public streets or alleys, and the owners of vacant lots, or the person inpossession or control of such vacant lots, shall be required to clear at once, and keep clean such vacant lots and public streets and alleys of leaves, trash, garbage, rubbish and junk.

SECTION 4. Any person owning property within the corporate limits of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, or the person in possession or control of such property, who fails to comply with all of the sections or provisions of this ordinance, and who fails within a reasonable time not exceeding ten (10) days after notice served on him by the Town Board, to comply with any and all of the sections or provisions of this ordinance shall be fined in the Police Court a sum of not less than Five Dollars (\$5.00) and Twenty-Five cents (\$.25) per day for each day of failure or refusal. The violation of any section or part of this ordinance constitutes a separate offense.

SECTION 5. All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith, in whole or in part, are hereby repealed.

SECTION 6. Passed byBoard of Trustees of the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, this the 7th day of June, 1932; and posted in three public places within the Town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky, and to be effective at once.
