The Board of Trustees of the Town of Dry Ridge, Grant County, Kentucky. In regular session on May 6, 1941, do ordain as following;

A tax of Sixty (60%) cents on each one hundred (§100.00) dollars of value as of July 1, 1941 is hereby levied for the general prupose of the town of Dry Ridge upon ### real and personal estate within the Town of Dry Ridge and all personal estate except such tangible personal property as has an actual and bonafide situs without the Town of Dry Ridge or persons domiciled or actually residing in the Town of Dry Ridge, on the first day of July, 1941, and all corporations having their chief offices or places of business in the town of Dry Ridge, Ky. on said date and all franchises of same, except those exempt from taxation by the constitutions or laws of the State of Kentucky. And the sare shall be assessed at their fair cash value estimated at the price they would bring at a fair voluntary sale. And all franchises or corporations cwined or having their chief offices or place of business outside the town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky.

There is also levied a poll tax of One Dollar ([1.50) and fifty cents on each male person over twenty-one years of age, residing in the town of Dry Ridge, Kentucky.

This Ordinance shall take effect after its adoption and publication as required by law.
