

The NKU Grant County Center will be hosting A.L.I.C.E. training (Alert, Lockdown, Inform, Counter, Evacuate) on Wednesday, December 9th (9:00am – 10:30am).

In response to recent national events, Northern Kentucky University is pleased to offer a new program to all faculty, staff, students and community partners to raise awareness and help prepare individuals on how to respond to a potential violent encounter.

The A.L.I.C.E. program will empower and educate the NKU community on how to handle and survive a critical violent event on campus. The program provides a basic history of school shootings, the motivation of these offenders, and provides options on how to respond if a violent shooter enters your building, office, or classroom. These options include: how to lockdown and barricade, evacuate, and counterattack depending on the dynamics of the situation.
