RESOLUTION

Whereas the City of Dry Ridge heretofore has purchased water from two suppliers, Bullock Pen Water District, and the City of Williamstown, Kentucky, and

Whereas the quality and quantity of water, pressure and flow, from the City of Williamstown, is superior in each respect when compared with that received from the Bullock Pen Water District, and

Whereas the District has consistently been unable to live up to contracts existing between the City of Dry Ridge and the District, and

Whereas the City of Williamstown is contemplating expansion of its water plant and wishes to know how much water the City of Dry Ridge intends to purchase from the City of Williamstown in the future, and

Whereas the residents of the City of Dry Ridge require a dependable, high quality, supply of drinking water,

NOW THEREFORE THE CITY COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF DRY RIDGE DOES RESOLVE:

To limit its purchase of water from the Bullock Pen Water District hereafter to 750,000 gallons per month, and to purchase the balance of its water requirements from the City of Williamstown, estimating present needs from Williamstown to be between two and three million gallons per month, which needs will increase as growth occurs.

Passed and approved at its regular continued meeting held at the City Building on November 18, 1971, by the affirmative votes of councilmen John D. Risen, Charles Edmondson, Herman Norton, James Middleton, Cecil Sargent and Kline Shipp.
